Inishbofin is a beautiful island off the Conamara coast. It has a population of almost two hundred people with a long history of occupation dating back to the Stone Age. It has several prehistoric sites including an early Christian monastery and a star shaped fort dating to the 17th century. The island is about five miles long by four miles wide and has a variety of habitats ideal for exploring, ranging from the sea stacks and promontory forts in the north-west to the dramatic cliffs in the north east. Beautiful meadows full of wild flowers. Excellent beaches and swimming facilities, and hail or sunshine we'll swim daily!!
